Structure

The Committee membership shall be comprised of seven members consisting of:

- One member from the Special Olympics BC Mackenzie
- One Member from AimHi Mackenzie
- One member from Northern Health Authority
- A Seniors Representative
- One member from industry or business
- Two members from the general public

Purpose

The Accessibility Advisory
Committee is a Select Committee
of Council established to provide
advice and recommendations to
Council on matters relating to
citizens with disabilities, seniors
and other citizens with access
issues that may impede
participation in everyday aspects of
community living.

Membership

All members, except the members from the general public shall remain members of the committee until resignation or the rescinding of appointment.

The members from the general public will be appointed by Council. One member holds a one year term and second member holds a two year term. The District will advertise each year for applications from the general public.

One member of Council is appointed as a liaison representative on an annual basis.

A Municipal Officer staff member sits on the committee to provide administrative support.
