Recognizing that Mackenzie's local economy has seen many changes over the decades, and that our last economic development plan is from 2007, we began developing a new Community Economic Development Plan earlier this year.

The goal of this project is to develop a roadmap for creating a diverse, vibrant local economy. Our new Community Economic Development Plan will clearly outline actions and strategies towards building an environmentally and financially sustainable local economy centred on diversity and inclusion.
