





Business Costs

Mackenzie is a great place to start a business, with competitive labour costs, regional incentives and affordable real estate that will help protect your bottom line as your business grows. Below you can find information on the baseline costs you can expect when you do business in Mackenzie.

Minimum Wage & Overtime



Overtime

Employees are paid **1.5 times their regular wage** after eight hours a day, up to 12 hours.

Employees are paid **two times their wage** for time worked over 12 hours a day.

Mandatory Benefits

Canada has two federal insurance plans , which employers and employees jointly pay into. There is also a statutory deduction for Worker's Compensation.

Canada Pension Plan (CPP)

The CPP ensures that Canadians have a basic income for retirement. Employers contribute 5.7% of employee wage to a maximum annual contribution of \$3,499.80 (2022).

Employer Contribution Employment Insurance (EI)

El ensures that workers have income available for them should they become unemployed. Employers pay 1.4 times the amount of the employee's premiums and stop deducting premiums when the employee's maximum insurable earnings (\$60,300 for 2022) or the maximum employee premium for the year (\$952.74 for 2022) is reached.

Worker's Compensation

WorkSafeBC collects premiums from businesses to cover the costs of work-related injuries. Your premiums fund the costs associated with work-related injuries or diseases, health care, wage loss, rehabilitation, and administration.

The average base rate for 2022 is 1.55% of employers' assessable payroll. For 2022, the maximum assessable payroll per worker is \$108,400.

Water and Sewer Systems

It is the District's priority to ensure that residents receive a high-quality water supply and waste water services.

Our residents expect to get clean potable water from their taps every day and this is ensured through the monitoring, testing, and maintenance of its water system.

The District operates two closed loop water distribution systems. For in-town residents, the water draws water from two wells, one located at First Beach and one at Second Beach. The reservoir, located next to Little Mack Ski Hill, holds approximately 596,000 cubic metres.

For Gantahaz residents, the District has two wells located on Alberta and Columbia Drive. The reservoir holds approximately 350,000 cubic metres.

To ensure continued high standards of drinking water quality and delivery for the District of Mackenzie and Gantahaz Subdivision, the District sends weekly water samples for bacterial testing and biennial samples for chemical testing.





Taxes & Fees

In British Columbia the only taxes that are unique in individual communities are property taxes. These are applied on the assessed value of land and improvements (buildings). There are no taxes on payrolls, machinery and equipment, or inventory.

Federal and Provincial Taxes

Canada has a **five percent (5%) value-added tax** called the Goods and Services Tax (GST). It is fully recoverable for all business inputs.

British Columbia has a **seven percent (7%) sales tax.** Various business inputs are exempt from the tax, including production machinery and equipment, software development, construction labour and various materials.

Corporate Income Tax

British Columbia's general corporate income tax rate is only 12%. When combined with the federal rate, British Columbia **businesses pay a combined general corporate** income tax rate of 27% — among the lowest in the G7.

Personal Income Tax

British Columbia has the lowest provincial personal income taxes in Canada for individuals earning up to \$125,000.

Northern Residents Deduction

If you have lived in Mackenzie on a permanent basis for work-related reasons for at least six consecutive months, you may qualify for the Northern Residents Deduction. This partial deduction can result in a significant tax saving on your personal income taxes.

Revitalization Tax Exemption Program

If you're looking to physically grow your business space with new construction or renovations, then this program might benefit you.



Why is this out-of-the-way ski hill so revered? Well, all the snow that Mackenzie gets, Powder King gets — and more. Average annual snowfall in the Pine Pass is 12.5 metres (41 feet). That's a lot of powder... hence the name. Known for all this snowfall and some awesome terrain, the mountain is a destination for skiers and boarders from across northern BC and beyond.

In a way, it doesn't hurt that it's somewhat hard to get to (unless you're in Mackenzie, that is), because here waiting in line for the chairlift is pretty unlikely. Plus, with most of its runs named after Beatles' tunes, your ski trip is guaranteed to put a smile on your face.

Need a place to stay? Powder King and the neighboring Azouzetta Lake Lodge, have year-round options for everyone, whether visiting for winter adventure or on a family camping trip in the summer.
