Dry Grad Dinner and Dance Venue Rental

Megan Brumovsky, resident, spoke in support of the 2024 graduating class of Mackenzie Secondary School Grad, who requested an in-kind grant to waive the rental fees to use the arena and the Community Hall for their Graduation on June 22nd. Approximate costs for renting both spaces would be \$2,000. Council approved the request.

The Skadi Tour - All 42 Lift Serviced Ski Areas in BC in 42 Days

The Tidbits of Change Foundation requested lift tickets for two people on January 31st as well as suggestions of an interesting character/legend/great story regarding the ski area. The cost for two-day passes would be \$65.00 Council approved the request.

BC Honours and Awards

Council moved for staff to advertise that nominations are now being accepted for British Columbia's two highest honours – the Order of British Columbia and the Medal of Good Citizenship. Nominations will be accepted until April 5, 2024.

Illumination of Mackenzie Recreation Centre for Epilepsy Awareness

Council received a request from the BC Epilepsy Society to light up the Rec Centre in purple on March 26, 2024 for International Purple Day for Epilepsy awareness. Mackenzie Figure Skating Club Request

Council received a request from the Mackenzie Figure Skating Club for a donation towards their comedy and casino night fundraiser that will be held on February 3, 2024. Council approved the request.

Revised 2024 Budget Schedule

Council approved the revised Council meeting dates for the 2024 annual budget process. The meetings formerly scheduled for January 22, 2024 and February 12, 2024 will be moved back one Council meeting date (and will now take place on February 12, 2024 and February 26, 2024 respectively).

2024 Water and Sewer and Garbage Bylaw Amendment

Council received a report on changing rates for water, sewer, and garbage billing. Staff also recommended that the Water Bylaw be changed to add a short notice request fee for short notice/emergency requests to Schedule B of the Bylaw, and that Residential garbage rates should be presented as an annual amount in Schedule A of the Garbage Bylaw.



Visitor Centre Caboose Operations 2024

Council deferred this item to the next meeting so that the matter can be discussed with the Chamber of Commerce.

Emergency Support Services Equipment and Training Grant App

Council approved the application to the UBCM Community Emergency Preparedness Fund for \$30,000 towards Emergency Social Services equipment, training, and personnel wages, and authorized the Chief Administrative Officer to execute the contract and any related documentation.

Accessible Parking and Parking Bylaw

Council passed a motion requesting staff to bring back a report on the bylaw language as it relates to accessible/disability parking spots, particularly as it relates to the size of them. A need has been identified to make space required for a loading zone. Council also passed a motion to change all 5 parking stalls in the front of the Recreation Centre to be designated specifically to accessible/disability parking, and to make the one closest to the ramp going to the upper parking lot largest to accommodate those using wheelchairs getting in/out of the side of vehicles.



Bylaws

Bylaw No. 1511 Annual Mayor and Council Remuneration Amendment

Council adopted this bylaw. This bylaw amends the Annual Mayor and Councillor Remuneration and Expenses No. 1338, 2015 so that the Remuneration for Mayor, Deputy Mayor, and Councillors will increase annually according to Consumer Price Index (CPI) Inflation to a maximum of 3%.

Bylaw No. 1512 Water Rates and Regulations Amendment, Bylaw No. 1513 Sewer Rates and Regulations Amendment, and Bylaw No. 1514 Garbage Rates and Regulations Amendment

Council gave these bylaws their first three readings. Below is a table showing the annual increase rates proposed in the Bylaw Amendments for Water, Sewer, and Garbage service rates.
