Regional District of Fraser-Fort George

Jim Martin, Chief Administrative Officer, and Michael Higgins, Manager of Emergency Services, presented to Council their proposed Integrated Emergency Management Program. The program would be a collaborative model with all the communities and First Nation Bands in the Regional District of Fraser-Fort George (RDFFG) working together to provide better emergency services to the whole region. The integrated approach would create better response and recovery programs as well as standard training, practice, and planning opportunities for each community. The Regional District requested representation from the Mackenzie staff on an Emergency Preparedness Initiative Working Group to further develop this integrated approach. Further information will be presented in fall 2017. Program implementation is expected for October 2018.

Regional District of Fraser-Fort George

Petra Wildauer, General Manager of Environmental Services, presented to Council in regards to the construction of a full service transfer station at the Mackenzie Regional Landfill. The Regional District of Fraser-Fort George received funding to convert the existing landfill into a transfer system which will truck garbage from Mackenzie to the Foothills Regional Landfill in Prince George. Public consultation regarding the landfill conversion will take place in late summer 2017. Opportunities for Mackenzie businesses to bid on contracts during and after the construction will be available on BC Bid once the Regional District has finalized their design and work plan.

Ms. Wildauer also announced that recycling services in Mackenzie will be changing as Recycle BC, previously known as Multi-Material BC, will be offering curbside blue box pick up to Mackenzie residents later in 2017. More details regarding the recycling program will be provided once available.
