Electric Golf Cart Use in Town

Residents Cody Homister, Jim Homister, and Jamie French, presented to Council about the potential of using electric golf carts from resident homes to the Mackenzie Golf & Country Club, due to the lack of available cart storage, and vehicle emissions. Council also received a letter from the Mackenzie Golf & Country Club President, supporting this request. Council deferred a decision on this matter pending further information.

Request for Support - Annual Duck Drop Fundraiser

Council voted in favour of the Mackenzie Outdoor Route and Trail Association hosting the Annual Duck Drop fundraiser at Second Beach on Morfee Lake, Saturday, June 28, 2025. The District will provide barricades and traffic control to help ensure public safety.

Request for Support – Northern Interior Rural Division of Family Practice

Council voted to provide Northern Interior Rural Division of Family Practice with three 6-month passes to the Mackenzie Recreation Centre to help welcome three new medical professionals to Mackenzie.

Request for Support – Mackenzie Secondary School Grad Committee Council voted to waive rental fees for the Mackenzie Recreation Centre Arena floor, and small sound system and table rentals as well as hall set up, for the 2025 Mackenzie Secondary School Graduating Class.
