Petitions and Delegations - Mackenzie Forest Landscape Plan

Jill Irwin, Section Head, Strategic Initiatives with Ministry of Forests, presented to Mayor and Council the Mackenzie Forest Landscape Plan. Forest Landscape Planning is a way to plan how forests are used and cared for over the long term. It helps balance different needs – like protecting nature, supporting local communities, and allowing for activities like logging or recreation. The Ministry is seeking your input by taking their survey between Nov. 10 and Dec. 22nd to help develop a Forest Landscape Plan that reflects the values of First Nations peoples, local communities and supports a sustainable forest sector.
