Petitions and Delegations

Chris Calder, Chief Administrative Officer, Regional District of Fraser-Fort George, presented an update on current regional initiatives, including solid waste management, emergency preparedness, changes to 911 call-answering services, health infrastructure projects, and advocacy efforts with other levels of government.

Mackenzie Figure Skating Club – Request for Additional Space

Council received correspondence from the Mackenzie Figure Skating Club requesting additional space within the Recreation Centre to support year-round operations. Council directed Administration to bring back a report outlining current Recreation Centre space usage, storage allocations, and available space options.

Logging and Sawmilling Journal Subscription Renewal

Council approved renewing the District's subscription to the Logging and Sawmilling Journal.

BC Hydro Peace Operations Public Information Session

Council directed staff to advertise the upcoming BC Hydro Public Meeting to present information on the Peace River Facilities and forecast information on Williston Reservoir and Site C Reservoir. The meeting will take place in the Recreation Centre on Thursday, May 14, at 7:00 pm.

Enbridge Sunrise Expansion Program

2025 Draft Financial Statements Presentation

Representatives from MNP LLP presented the draft 2025 Financial Statements to Council. The District received a clean audit opinion with no irregularities or concerns identified during the audit process. Council approved the 2025 Financial Statements. MackChu Brewing – Patio License Application

Council reviewed a referral from the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch regarding MackChu Brewing Ltd.'s proposed seasonal patio. After considering public feedback and agency comments, Council deferred the decision to a future meeting to allow further discussion on parking and safety matters.

Mackenzie Legion – Temporary Extension of License Area (LP)

Council supported the Mackenzie Legion Branch 237's application to the Liquor and Cannabis Regulation Branch for a Temporary Extension of their Licensed Area for the Mackenzie 60th Celebration on May 16, 2026.

399 Mackenzie Boulevard – Community Market Park

Council received a report regarding 399 Mackenzie Boulevard (Community Market Park) for information. The park was originally developed through a license agreement on a formerly contaminated site, which is now being returned to the property owner for environmental remediation work. Imperial Oil, the property owner, has indicated plans to begin excavation and cleanup activities in early June 2026, requiring the removal of park infrastructure by the end of May 2026. Administration will continue discussions regarding relocation options for the Community Market and park amenities ahead of planned site remediation activities.
